



# THE PROGRAMMES

### BIOSCIENCES

Ideal for students interested in biological or biomedical sciences, this programme builds core lab, research and analytical skills. You'll run experiments, and get hands-on insight into key areas of biosciences that underpin technological advances in biomedical sciences.

### MEDICINE

Our medicine programme offers an opportunity to build confidence, refine your practical and research skills, and gain fresh insight into the varied roles within modern medicine. This programme is designed for medical students preparing to enter their clinical years and for those on related healthcare programmes.

### PUBLIC HEALTH

Designed for students interested in healthcare or population health, this programme builds core skills in understanding disease patterns and health outcomes. You'll learn to analyse health data and tackle real-world challenges, showing how public-health thinking supports clinical practice.



# MEDICINE

Our medicine programme is structured around three weekly themes:

## COMMUNICATION

Start by exploring how communication shapes healthcare. Get to know your fellow students through team-building and creative workshops, and learn how to engage patients and the public, tackle misinformation, and present ideas clearly.

## CLINICAL

Develop key clinical skills through simulation sessions in our Consultation Skills Learning Centre. You'll practice patient-centred communication, take part in an interactive prescribing workshop, and hear from clinicians about their career journeys.

## RESEARCH

Experience medical research in action through lab work, ethics discussions, and research design workshops. Attend a talk from the General Medical Council, explore postgraduate study, and celebrate your work at the final awards ceremony.



# BEYOND THE CLASSROOM

## FEES & FINANCE

The fee for attending a summer school is £3,000.

You will need to budget for living costs to cover food, travel and personal expenses, and are required to arrange your own travel and health insurance before arriving in Manchester.

## WHAT'S COVERED

- **Accommodation:** You'll be allocated a room in a single-sex shared student accommodation close to campus, with other summer school participants.
- **Airport Transfers:** Group airport transfers to and from Manchester Airport are organised for arrivals on 18–19 July and departures on 8–9 August.
- **Day Excursions:** Organised group day trips offer the chance to visit historic cities such as York and explore scenic areas like the Lake District.
- **Activities & Socials:** Weekly social activities offer opportunities to meet other students and explore Manchester, from quiz nights and film evenings to city-based challenges.
- **Postgraduate Pathways:** A dedicated session exploring future study options at Manchester, with opportunities to meet programme directors, current PhD students, and hear from leading researchers.

## ELIGIBILITY & HOW TO APPLY

To check if you're eligible, speak to your home university contact. Students from our associate universities must apply through their university lead, who is responsible for selecting students to attend the programme.
